Psalm 139

The following questions are designed to help you in responding to the all knowing, all present and all powerful God.

GOD IS OMNISCIENT - "All Knowing"

1. Read and meditate on the following passages: Proverbs 15:3, Psalm 56:8, Matthew 10:30, Hebrews 4:13. What do you observe about God's personal knowledge of you?
2. Read Psalm 139:1-6. How does God's omniscience give you comfort and security? Does it threaten you in any way? Why or why not?

GOD IS OMNIPRESENT - "All Present"

1. What do you learn in the following passages about God's omnipresence?
2 Kings 6:8-14, The book of Jonah, Psalm 139:7-12, Isaiah 41:18
2. How would your choices differ if you were conscious that God was right beside you?
3. Understanding God's omnipresence, are your secret sins really secret?
4. How would your speech change if you were conscious that God was listening to your every word?

GOD IS OMNIPOTENT - "All Powerful"

1. Read and meditate on the following passages. Note any observations about God's omnipotence. Psalm 62:11, Isaiah 40:28, Psalm 89:11, Jeremiah 32:17, Psalm 139:13-16, Romans 4:17
2. Is anything too hard for God? Read Luke 1:30-37 and Mark 10:17-27. What about in your own life? Is there something you have given up on as impossible? Why not take that "impossible dream" and put it at the top of your prayer list?

RE-READ PSALM 139 CAREFULLY.

1. What was David's response to these omni-attributes of God? Look specifically at verses 17-24.
2. How does your understanding of these aspects of God's nature affect your self image. How should it affect your view of God's holiness? Memorize Psalm 139:23,24.
3. Look up the following verses and list what "God is able" to do in your life: Ephesians 3:20; 2 Timothy 1:12; Hebrews 7:25; Jude 24

CHALLENGE: Use Psalm 139:23,24 as your daily prayer and spend time reviewing God's presence and power in your life. Celebrate some aspect of your personality, physical attributes, and soul response that reminds you that you are "fearfully and wonderfully made."
